HIGHER EDUCATION IN POLAND

- Over 130 Higher Education Institutions (HEIs):
 - public (state) & non-public (private)
- Full-time studies at the state HEIs are free of charge for Polish students
- Three-cycle framework of higher education qualifications:
 - 1st cycle studies (Bachelor) 3 or 3.5 years
 - 2nd cycle studies (Master) 2 or 1.5 years
 - 3rd cycle studies (PhD) min. 4 years
 - long cycle studies – uniform Master's studies e.g. medicine, law, psychology
- Academic calendar – winter & summer semester
- Examinations & Grading system
- European Credit Transfer System (ECTS)

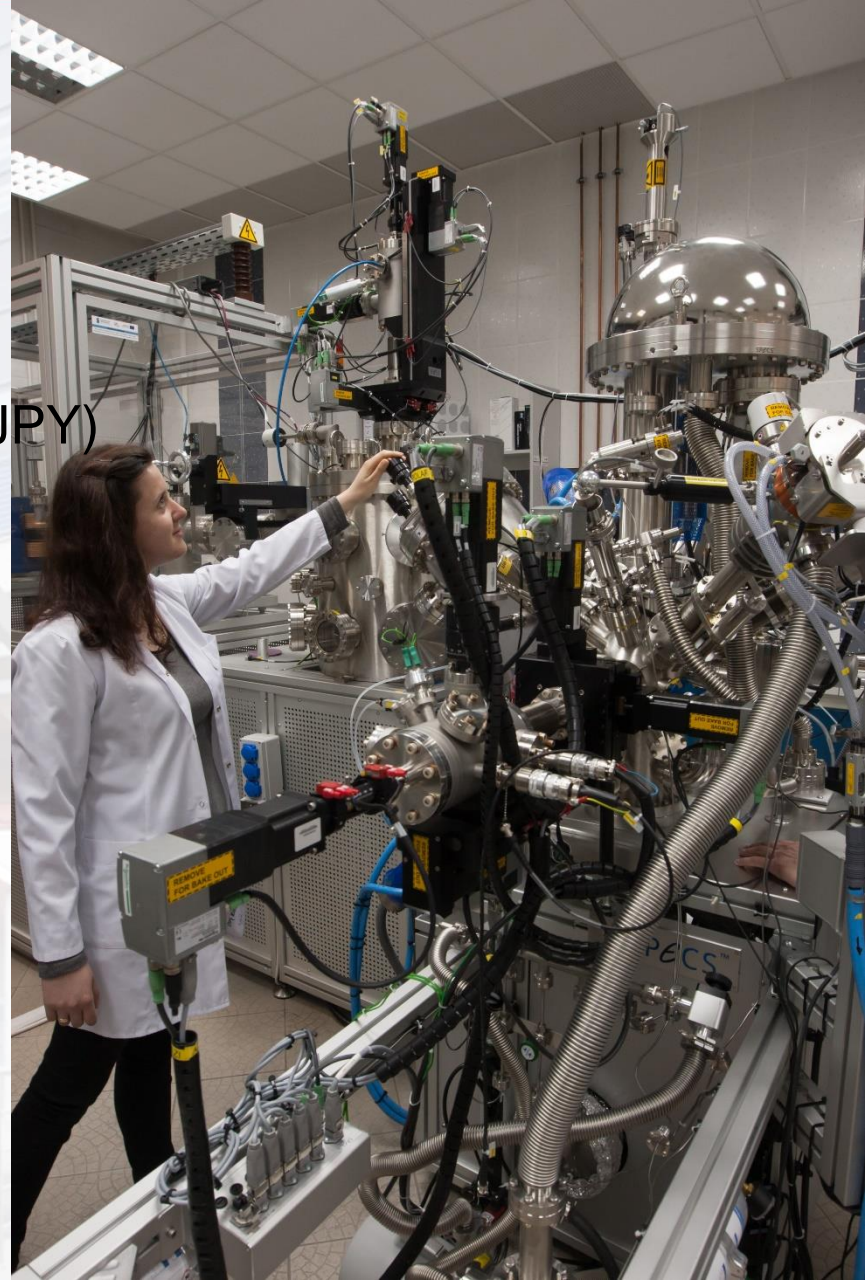
EXCHANGE PROGRAMME

- research – 3 months
- study – 1 semester
- in the field of LIFE SCIENCES
e.g. biology, biotechnology,
biochemistry
- other fields under the Faculty of
Natural Sciences e.g. chemistry,
physics, mathematics, geography
- individual study programme for
each student



EXCHANGE PROGRAMME

- no tuition fee
- cost of living in Kielce 440 EUR (54 715 JPY) per month & expenses:
 - Dormitory 100 EUR (12 435 JPY)
 - Food 150 EUR (18 650 JPY)
 - Public transport 15 EUR (1 865 JPY)
 - Entertainment 130 EUR (16 165 JPY)
 - Study material 20 EUR (2 490 JPY)
 - Mobile phone 25 EUR (3 110 JPY)
